Further to our email of 29th July 2022 regarding your request for the following information:

I am writing to seek information you may hold in relation to the former military test site at Orford Ness, Suffolk. The is located approximately at Ordnance Survey Grid Refence (645290 Easting 250680 Northing), see figure below (extract from Google Earth, July 2022), herein referred to as 'the site'. The information is required in order to manage health and safety during the development of the Norfolk Boreas and Vanguard Offshore Wind Farm (OWF) a Lesser Black-backed Gull (LBBG) compensation project. A review of public domain information indicates that the site was used as a military test site during the World Wars and up until the Cold War.

Royal HaskoningDHV are undertaking an desk based contaminated land assessment. We would be grateful if you could search the military archive records associated with the site and a 250 m buffer around the site, so that we can further inform our contaminated land assessment and manage health and safety on site.

Information of interest would include and is not limited to details on the following:

- *Any historical contaminated land assessments and unexploded ordnance (UXO) surveys or clearance certificates.*
- *Areas of historical land infilling/waste disposal, including burning grounds.*
- *What was tested on the site, with particular respect to contaminants which may be within the site, which could include and are not limited to: radiological, chemical weapons or explosive residues.*
- *Historical site usage and inventory of building usages and activities undertaken on site, such as manufacturing or engineering workshops.*
- *Details regarding building construction.*
- *Historical plans of the test site.*
- *Historical photographs of the former military test site (including aerial) and this area in particular.*

As this request is for environmental information, your request has been handled as a request for information under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (the Regulations). The Regulations are broadly similar to the FOI Act, but specifically apply to environmental information.

We can confirm that the Atomic Weapons Establishment (AWE) holds part of the information in scope of your request, some of which we can release, while some is withheld due to its classification.

Annex A contains a document which provides information pertaining to the first of your specific points:

- *Any historical contaminated land assessments and unexploded ordnance (UXO) surveys or clearance certificates.*



This document has been redacted in line with Regulations 12(5)(a), which provides that a public authority may refuse to disclose information to the extent that its disclosure would adversely affect international relations, defence, national security or public safety, and 13(1), in which the Atomic Weapons Establishment (AWE) are obliged to comply with the Data Protection Act 2018 and UK GDPR and as such are prohibited from disclosing personal data to third parties where doing so would breach the data protection principles set out in the UK GDPR.

Regulation 12(5)(a) is subject to the Public Interest Test (PIT) which has been conducted and has on balance fallen in favour of applying the exception and providing a redacted copy of the document. Building numbers are routinely redacted from documents as it is deemed that providing this level of detail could assist our adversaries in building up a picture of the sites' layouts and potentially allowing them to target specific areas of the sites. Any disruption to the activities undertaken at AWE would ultimately impact on the ability to safeguard the defence of the nation.

We can confirm that AWE holds several other documents in scope of your request, however these are being withheld, also under Regulation 12(5)(a) of the EIR. The PIT has been conducted and has fallen in favour of applying the exception and as such withholding the information contained in these documents in full.

AWE recognises that the Regulations make a presumption in favour of disclosure wherever possible, and that there is some public interest in transparency around the historical use of the site at Orford Ness, especially because it is now a publicly accessible nature reserve. However, there is a strong compelling public interest in safeguarding national security and in withholding any information that might prejudice it.

The retained information has been considered previously and again for this request, and it is still considered highly classified.

Details of the build standards of AWRE trials at Orfordness remain classified because specifics of the components and design of previous nuclear weapons would still be useful to adversaries or third-party states trying to create their own nuclear weapons or trying to find flaws in the UK's deterrent. Details of previous tests may also inadvertently provide information about the UK's current warhead, which would give adversaries crucial details about the deterrent and consequently allow them to build up a picture of the UK's overall capabilities. This would reduce the effectiveness of the deterrent and impinge on the defence of the United Kingdom.

On balance it is considered that although there is an argument for transparency and release, this is outweighed by the high likelihood that the information contained in the documents would be useful to adversaries to create their own nuclear weapon; with the consequence that the UK's national security would be prejudiced. As releasing information about previous and current nuclear weapons programmes would also breach the UK's legal obligations and interests under Article 1 of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, the information is being withheld.

Under EIR Regulation 9, the duty to advise and assist, we'd like to point you to several sources of information that are available within the public domain.

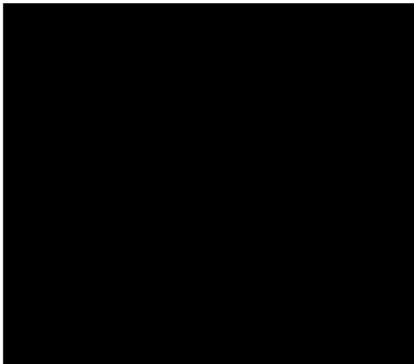

Further to my letter of the 18th November, I enclose drawings nos. 3020, 3052 and 3089 setting out the Board's proposals for the construction of the gabion system and clay wall to the south of the existing wall. The construction of these works will, with the permission of your Authority, involve the winning of 37,950 cu. yds. of material from the marsh area and 600 cu. yds. of shingle from the area previously used.

Drawing no. 3176 also enclosed shows in red the area from which it is proposed to obtain the clay. This area is larger than will prove necessary but due to changes in soil conditions the Engineer wishes to give himself sufficient area in which to operate. Precautions will of course be taken to ensure that the site is left in reasonable condition before it is vacated.

I shall be very pleased to receive the Authority's permission to carry out this work and also to the winning of the materials as outlined above.

Thank you for your letter of the 24th December, 1963, concerning the Board's proposals for new sea defences in the Aldeburgh area and for the drawings which you enclosed.

I am pleased to inform you that the Atomic Energy Authority have no objection to the works detailed in the drawings concerned, nor to the winning of 37,950 cubic yards of clay from the marsh area and 600 cubic yards of shingle from within our Northern security fence in the area previously used. No charge will be made for the clay but the price for the shingle will be 1/- per cubic yard as previously agreed with your [REDACTED].

We are, however, anxious that you should ensure that the existing natural drainage in the marsh area from which the clay will be taken, is not affected. We are also concerned that the area should be left in reasonable condition at the termination of your operations.

It would be helpful if you could let me know sometime before the major operations are commenced, as I should like to arrange at that time to inspect the area with your [REDACTED].

In connection with the works now being undertaken to strengthen the Aldeburgh Sea Defences, the River Board have been considering the desirability of further and more extensive beach nourishment along the length of the wall and also at the scour hole beyond the southern terminal of the wall and in this connection, the Hydraulics Research Department are carrying out an investigation to determine the littoral drift. It is anticipated that something in the region of 200,000 cubic yards of shingle will be required and I am therefore approaching your Authority to enquire whether they would be prepared to consider the required material being obtained from the areas shown coloured pink on the enclosed plan.

No borings have been taken to determine the depth of shingle that is available and it would be more economical from the Board's point of view to take it out to the maximum depth to which it is available.

I should be pleased to hear that your Authority will again be willing to assist the Board in this matter and whether you would wish to impose any terms or conditions on the winning of this material. It may be that in view of the amount of shingle required, you would wish to discuss this matter possibly on site.

You wrote to me on the 7th February, 1964, concerning the proposed sea defence works in the Aldeburgh area, which the East Suffolk & Norfolk River Board wish to undertake using quantities of shingle from A.W.R.E., Orfordness.

I am to inform you on behalf of the Authority, that there is no objection in principle to the River Board proposal to extract up to 200,000 cubic yards of shingle from the areas shown in your drawing CG/19/9.

In conveying to you this agreement in principle, I should point out that the Authority would wish to impose certain conditions. These could possibly be best considered at a site meeting which I should be happy to attend at any time convenient to you, but I outline them briefly here in order that you can give them some preliminary consideration.

1. The Authority would charge the River Board 1/- per cubic yard for shingle extracted from A.W.R.E., Orfordness.
2. The method of extraction and transportation to Aldeburgh must be agreeable to the Authority.
3. No shingle shall be extracted from below the island water table.
4. If at any time during the works, the extraction of shingle should interfere with known or future works of the Atomic Energy Authority, then the Authority reserve the right to terminate this agreement.

Obviously, we should hope to allow you to complete the extraction of shingle with as little interference as possible and I can, at this stage, assure you of our wish to co-operate to the full.

It may be that in view of the amount of shingle, and consequently the sum of money, involved, that you would wish to have this agreement more formally set out. If this is so, perhaps you would let me know, but otherwise the Authority would be content to rest the agreement upon an exchange of letters.

I write to confirm the result of our meeting on Tuesday, 28th April when it was agreed that the River Board would accept the terms set out in your letter of the 11th March regarding the taking of shingle from the property of the Authority as indicated on the drawing already submitted.

The Board note condition No.4 regarding the right of the Authority to terminate the agreement and appreciate that this is something which is perhaps inevitable. The Board understand however, that you will give as much notice as is possible should this course of action become necessary, and I must make the point that termination of the Agreement might have serious effects for the Board since the essence of the works for which the shingle is required is that a sufficient quantity should be placed on the foreshore at Aldeburgh more or less in one operation.

I should also inform you that the Board would desire to remove the shingle by a light railway track and the intention is that this should be left in position so that the Board can carry out any intermittent feeding of shingle which may later become apparent. I trust that the Authority will have no objection to this.

The Engineer will send to you direct a plan showing the route of the railway track.

You did enquire as to when the Board would be able to start. From a very brief perusal of the plant position from tenders received it would appear that the railway track and wagons cannot be delivered for a period of sixteen to eighteen weeks and as you know I am not yet in a position to place any orders.

Further to my conversation with you last week I confirm that we would like to take a quantity of shingle from the Island and transport it up to Aldeburgh for work on the Sea Defences. Quantities involved are approximately as follows:

1. 600 Cu. yds. for the shingle plug at the south end of the proposed new clay wall.
2. 2,000 to 3,000 Cu. yds. for re-constructing the shingle berm behind the new sea wall through the breached section.
3. 2,000 Cu. yds to be utilized between the main borrow pit area and Aldeburgh for the making up of a solid base for the laying of the rail track.

These quantities of shingle are in addition to the amount of 200,000 Cu. yds odd negotiated for by our Head Office for beach nourishment purposes.

Your approval to the removing of this quantity of shingle is requested and a payment of 1/- per Cu. yd. royalty will be made to you by the Board.

It is hoped to start moving some of this up as soon as we have your approval.

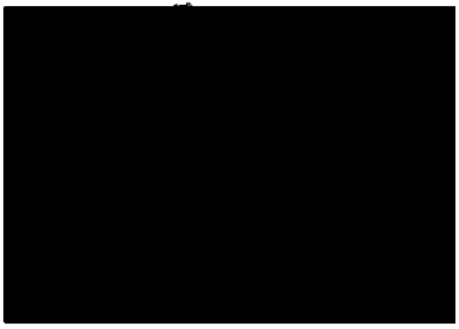

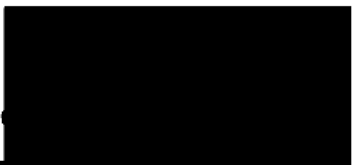

£96,000 To Save The Coastline

TO complete the sea defences at Slaughden, about 300,000 cubic yards of shingle are being transported by rail from natural deposits in the waste area behind Sudbourne beach.

The East Suffolk and Norfolk River Board have laid 3½ miles of narrow gauge single line track over the marshland, and four 30 h.p. diesel locomotives are running over this track continuously. Each locomotive draws 17 hopper-like trucks each of which is capable of carrying over two tons of shingle.

The difficulties of single line operation have been overcome by the construction of sidings and loop-lines.

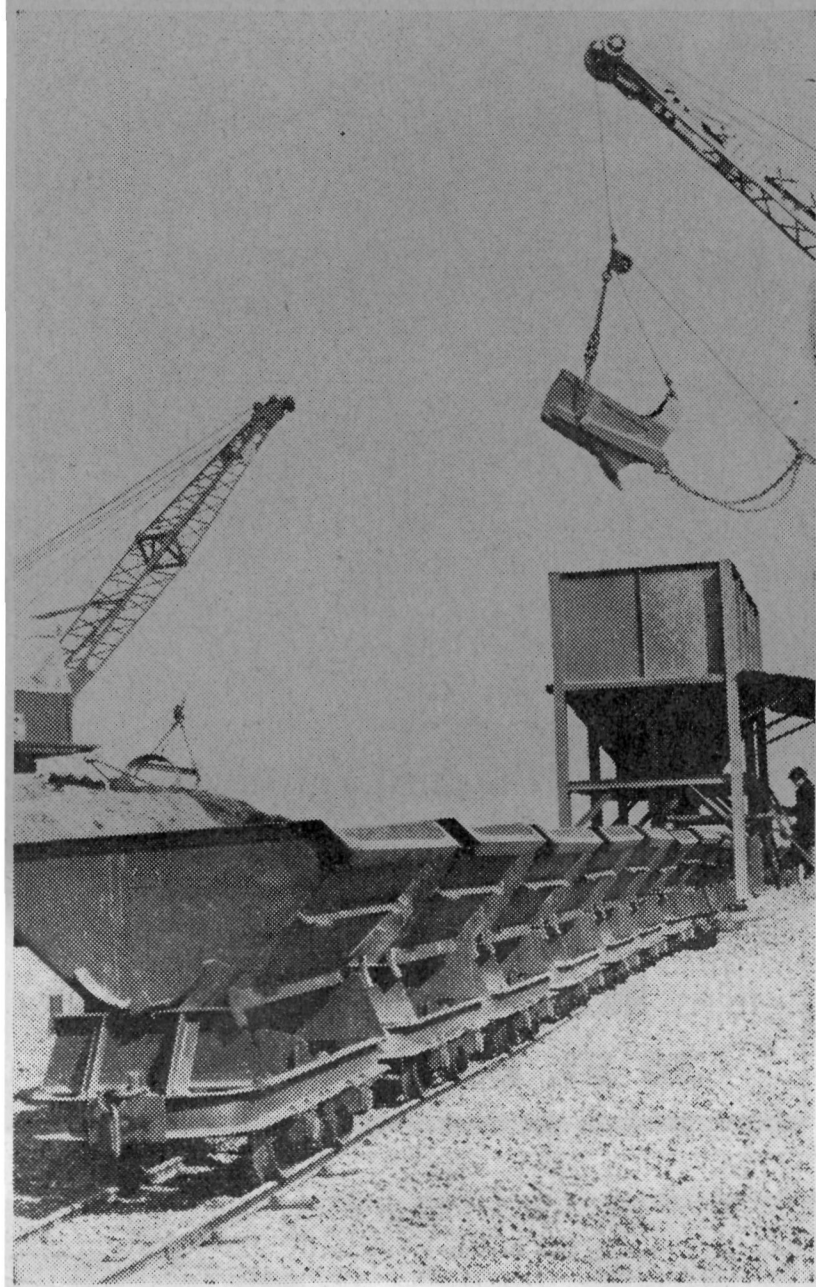
At Sudbourne, the trucks are filled from two large hoppers and the loading operation for each train takes less than five minutes. Two grab cranes are kept working to keep the hoppers filled.

The shingle is being unloaded from the top of the defence wall at Slaughden, near the Martello Tower, to replenish the beach between the groyne system. It is planned to dress the shingle into a gentle slope to the water in order to absorb wave action and lessen the possibilities of erosion.

Approximately 800 tons of shingle can be moved each day, weather permitting.

When the beach replenishment is completed attention will be directed to the large bay which was scoured out at the end of the concrete defences in the storms of 1963. Wire baskets filled with concrete rubble have been prepared and will be sunk in this area as groynes.

The cost of the present work, which is expected to be completed within 18 months, has been put at over £96,000.



A.W.P.E. Orfordness - Extraction of Shingle
by East Suffolk & Norfolk River Board

We spoke about the agreements I have concluded with the East Suffolk & Norfolk River Board for the extraction of shingle from land owned by the Authority at Orfordness, and I promised to let you have copies of the relevant correspondence, together with a covering minute, to enable you to establish a procedure for the issue and payment of invoices.

The River Board, as agents of the Ministry of Transport, is undertaking a major coast protection scheme within the Aldeburgh Borough boundary, on land immediately north of ours at Orfordness. As an aid to this, we were asked to allow the extraction of shingle for transportation by light railway, built from Orfordness to the Aldeburgh boundary. By agreement with [REDACTED], C.A.O., and [REDACTED], M.C.S., this is being dealt with by me as a Legal and Lands matter rather than on a contractual basis, although I have copied the correspondence to date, to [REDACTED].

The two agreements referred to are as follows:-

1. 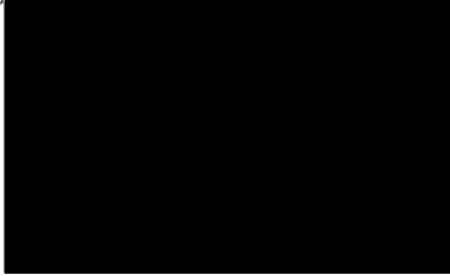

A.W.R.E. Orfordness - Extraction of Shingle
by East Suffolk & Norfolk River Board

We spoke about the agreements I have concluded with the East Suffolk & Norfolk River Board for the extraction of shingle from land owned by the Authority at Orfordness, and I promised to let you have copies of the relevant correspondence, together with a covering minute, to enable you to establish a procedure for the issue and payment of invoices.

The River Board, an agent of the Ministry of Transport, is undertaking a major coast protection scheme within the Aldeburgh Borough boundary, on land immediately north of ours at Orfordness. As an aid to this, we were asked to allow the extraction of shingle for transportation by light railway, built from Orfordness to the Aldeburgh boundary. By agreement with [REDACTED], C.A.O., and [REDACTED] M.C.S., this is being dealt with by me as a Legal and Lands matter rather than on a contractual basis, although I have copied the correspondence to date, to [REDACTED].

The two agreements referred to are as follows:-

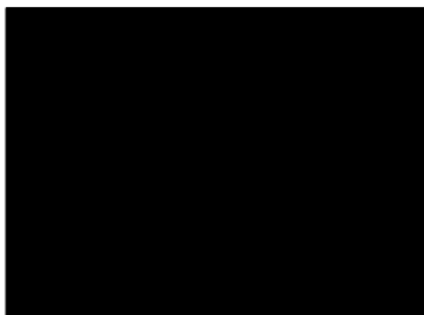

An area of the shingle bank and marshes on the peninsula now occupied by the Atomic Weapons Research Establishment at Orfordness, was for some time during the war, used as a bombing range. The East Suffolk and Norfolk River Authority are now engaged in the extraction of shingle from the shingle bank, which forms part of this area, in aid of cost defence work at Aldeburgh, under licence from the Atomic Energy Authority.

During the recent past, a number of unexploded missiles of various types have been uncovered, and we have called in your Bomb Disposal Units from R.A.F. Debden, H.M.S. Vernon, and the Royal Engineers at Mundesley, under the auspices of the Eastern Area Ammunition Inspectorate of the Royal Army Ordnance Corps at Hounslow. Because of the fear that further missiles may be uncovered, I have now received a request from the East Suffolk & Norfolk River Authority, for consideration to be given to a further survey of the area, with a view to a B.A.C. sweep.

The attached drawing shows the extent of the area, which is, of course, accessible only from this establishment. Will you please let me know, as a matter of urgency, the procedure for obtaining clearance in this somewhat extensive area, shown cross-hatched in red, and any details which you may consider necessary regarding the duration of the exercise, and the cost if any, involved.

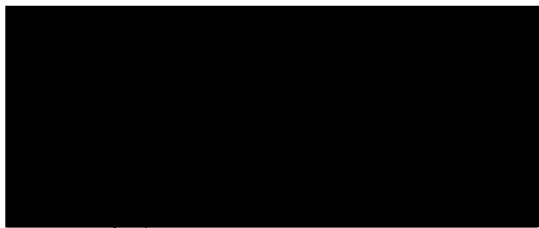

1. A full search of our records has been completed and the following points are forwarded for your information:-

- a. We have dealt with one river mine at ORFORD - on 17 June 60.
- b. We have no records of having provided any other assistance.
- c. No beach mines were laid on the ORFORD BEACH, KING'S MARSHES, LANTERN MARSHES or SUDBOURNE BEACH.
- d. The limits of minefields, exclusive of the areas noted in c. above were, to the SOUTH, OXLEY MARSHES and to the NORTH, SLAUGHDEN.
- e. We do not rule out the possibility of mines, or other explosive objects, being washed in.

2. It is our considered opinion that the possibility of beach mines in the area is less than in the beach areas North of GREAT YARMOUTH.

3. It would appear that the area to be cleared is some half mile in length varying from a few yards to a quarter of a mile in depth. We are prepared to undertake surface and immediate sub-soil clearance of the area.

4. You will be contacted by the NCO IC 1 Minefield Troop (Detachment) at MUNDESLEY in the course of the next few weeks when detailed arrangements for clearance will be undertaken.

5. It must be pointed out that our clearance can only cover the ground as it is at the time of operations. Tidal effects preclude us from issuing a once and for all clearance certificate. We do however guarantee clearance to a depth of 4' for the existing beach and seashore levels.

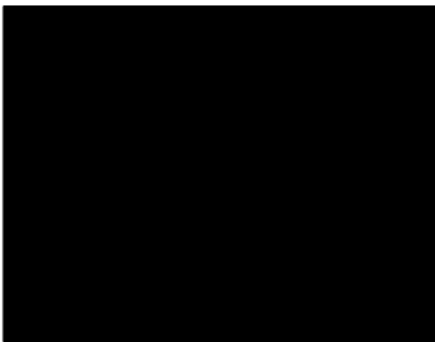

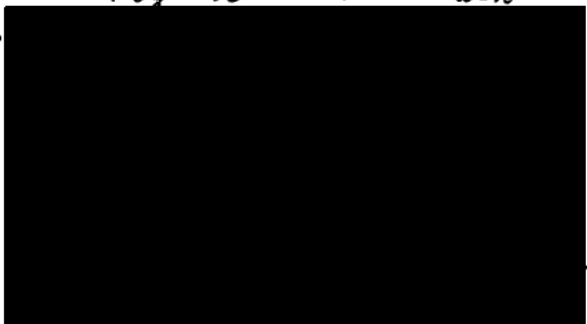

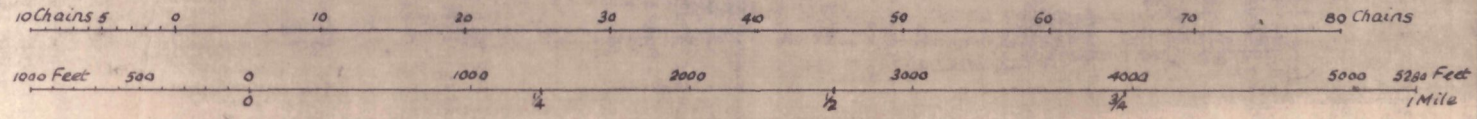

UNEEXPLODED MISSILES UNEARTHED AT ORFORDNESS.

Sir,

[redacted], A.E.A.C., reports that at 8.45.am. on Monday 28th June 1965, at A.W.R.E. Orfordness, whilst making a check on the signboard at the north boundary of the Establishment, it was reported to him by [redacted] of the East Suffolk & Norfolk Rivers Board, that a missile had been unearthed by the mechanical diggers working in the shingle.

[redacted] went to the digging site and saw a large missile, 4 feet six inches in length, and about 3 feet in circumference, which had been lifted out of the shingle in the scoop of the mechanical digger.

[redacted], who was in charge of the work, was instructed by the [redacted] to move the digger away from the missile, and that no further work should proceed in the immediate vicinity. A red and white marked pole was placed in position in which the missile was left.

[redacted] was informed of this incident at 9.50.am. and he agreed that the Bomb Disposal Authorities should be alerted forthwith. This was done at 9.55.am.

The local police officer, [redacted], East Suffolk County Police, was informed of the location of the missile and the actions already taken by A.E.A.C. this information was passed to him at 10.am on 28th June 1965.

As a result of the report made to the B/D Authorities, a unit under [redacted] R.A.F., arrived at Orfordness at 3.p.m. on 28th June, and was accompanied into the marsh area by [redacted], where an examination was to be made.

On arrival at the digging site it was reported to the [redacted] that another missile had been unearthed by the same mechanical digger, but in the new position to which it had been moved as a result of the warning given by [redacted] earlier in the day.

Both missiles were examined by [redacted] who declared both the missiles to be dangerous. The larger missile being a 500 lb G.P. bomb, and the smaller being a 112 lb R.L. bomb.

[redacted] said that he would like it to be put on record that in his opinion, the continued use of heavy mechanical grabs in the present digging area could prove to be dangerous to the men employed in the movement of the shingle.

The destruction of the two missiles will take place at a later date.

As you are aware one of your mechanical diggers uncovered a further bomb on Monday, 23rd June, 1965, during shingle extraction at Orfordness. This turned out to be a 500 lb. G.P. bomb, which has today been detonated by the R.A.F. Bomb Disposal team. The Officer in charge of this unit, [REDACTED], has said that he would like it to be put on record that in his opinion the continued use of heavy mechanical grabs in the present digging area could prove to be dangerous to the men employed in the extraction of shingle. I thought you should be aware of this opinion in view of our previous correspondence on this subject and the Atomic Energy Authority's request for indemnity in respect of these operations about which I wrote to you earlier today.

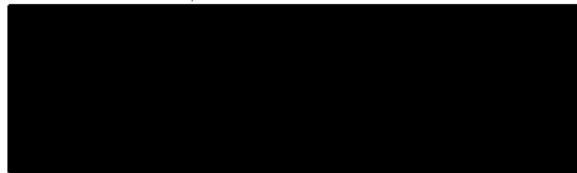



The subject of the Aldeburgh Sea Defences came up at our meetings of the River Authority last Friday when the royalty of 1s.0d. per cubic yard which your Authority is charging was questioned in view of the fact that it has been necessary to transfer for some considerable distance the site for the acquisition of the shingle. This movement has arisen solely because of the presence of unexploded missiles on the original borrow pit site, something which was not disclosed to us when we originally negotiated with you and on these grounds alone it was felt that there were very good reasons for the Authority to make some reduction in the royalty.

It is also a fact that your site does receive some benefit from the work which is being carried out at Aldeburgh since if the sea did break through at Aldeburgh the whole tidal range in the River Alde would be altered to the detriment of the island.

Perhaps therefore, in the light of the above you could reconsider the charge of 1s.0d. per cubic yard and agree to make some reduction to the River Authority.



I refer to your letter of 15th September, 1965, asking for a reduction in the royalties for shingle extracted from A.W.R.E. land at Orfordness in aid of the Aldeburgh sea defences.

Your enquiry has now been fully considered by the Atomic Energy Authority, and I regret to inform you that we cannot agree to a reduction in the royalty.

It is considered that the current rate of 1/- per cubic yard is a purely nominal charge and bears no relation to the commercial price of such shingle. In addition, I should point out that although the number of unexploded missiles on the original burrow pit site was not disclosed, as it was not known to us, your engineers are well aware, and always have been, that the area of Orfordness was used as a bombing range by the previous owners of the land. The area from which you are now extracting shingle is much nearer our own activities, and is the area in which any future development of Orfordness by the Atomic Energy Authority must necessarily take place. I should tell you that it was only with some reluctance, and in order to honour our agreements, that approval was finally given for the transfer of the extraction to this new area.

Additionally, your activities on the site involve us to a considerable extent, and such services as the unrestricted use of our ferry are carried out free of charge.

I hope that you will, on re-consideration, accept that this nominal charge is reasonable, and assure you of our wish for the utmost co-operation with the River Authority.

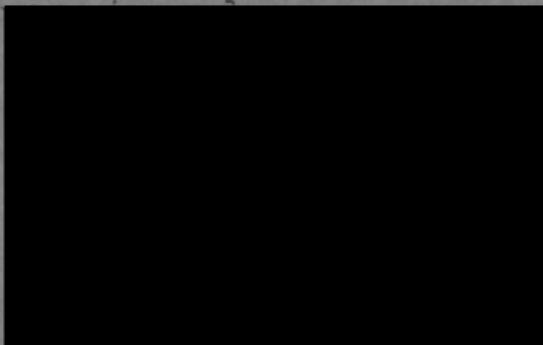

Under this proposed arrangement, which is I understand to be considered by the River Authority in the immediate future, concrete in the form of cubes of approximately one cubic yard, will be broken up by Messrs. Clarke Demolition and Construction Co. Ltd., acting as agents of the River Authority, into suitable sized fragments for transport by road to the light railway from whence they will be carried to Slaughden. There are approximately 2,200 of these cubes, which were laid during the 1939/45 War, to prevent aircraft or gliders landing on the old aerodrome which comprises part of Orfordness island.

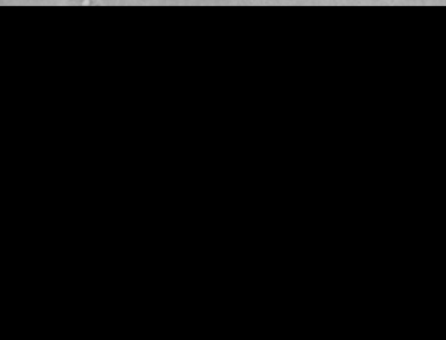
- (1) Excavations by the East Suffolk & Norfolk Rivers Board are due to cease late September or early October this year. It is not anticipated that further work will be undertaken unless there is a major breakdown in the sea defences.
- (2) The inner security fence is shown on the plan as an unbroken red line.
- (3) The north and south boundary fences are shown at each end of the drawing. These fences stretch from the H.W. mark (sea wall) to the river Ore (river wall). The fences are shown in red.
- (4) The positions of the various sign boards are shown by black circles.
- (5) The area of the Establishment above high water mark is shaded in yellow, and includes the thin strip of shingle bank which forms the sea wall from the lighthouse area to the north boundary fence.
- (6) The brown shaded area indicates that area in which personnel from H.M.S. Vernon carried out a surface search.
- (7) There are no records of a search by R.A.F. having been carried out in 1958 in the area known as 'borrow pit'. As far as is known any area from which clay has been removed to make up the river walls is known as a 'borrow pit'. The two main areas from which clay has been removed for this purpose are shown on the drawing in green shading, neither of these areas were searched by R.A.F. as far as is known.

There was, however, an area on the mainland (indicated by large red circle on drawing) which was known as 'burrow pit', and this area was, in some way, connected with activities carried out by M.O.A.

What these activities were, and whether or not a search was made in that area by R.A.F. in 1958, is not known.

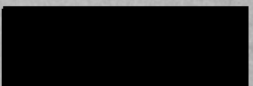
