Further to our previous correspondence regarding your request for the following information:

- * Whether the AWE holds any information about F Med 20 records, also known as Form Medical 20 and Form Med 20, historically used by the military to record health information*
- * A summary of any information held, including how many such records*
- * A copy of a 'special directive' issued by department AR8 of the MoD prior to 1959, which was the private office of the Under Secretary of State for Air, about the disposal of such forms. It appears likely such a directive would now be kept with the AWE's historic archives of material relating to the tests*
- * Any guidance or information available about a file with the reference A.12928/JIJ/8/56/5,000*

Your request has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act).

Thorough searches have been carried out to locate the information that you have requested and we can confirm that AWE has not been able to locate any relevant information in scope of your request.
