Who we are

AWE's purpose is to protect the UK through nuclear science and technology. The UK Government has a policy to maintain a continuous at-sea deterrent, discouraging the most severe threats to our nation.

We're immensely proud of how we contribute to national security, through developing, manufacturing and maintaining the warheads for the nuclear deterrent, as well as providing our unique skills and expertise to support counter-terrorism and nuclear threat reduction.

Since 2021, AWE has been a non-departmental public body, owned by the Ministry of Defence.



We are safe and secure

Under instruction of the Ministry of Defence, AWE is responsible for operating its sites safely and securely.

Being safe and secure runs deeply through our entire organisation. From an uneven path to a spillage in the canteen, every member of our team knows they are accountable for reporting even the most minor of concerns, and how to do this

As a local resident, you may be aware of the Radiation Emergency Preparedness and Public Information Regulations (more commonly known as REPPIR). Like all nuclear-licensed sites, AWE is subject to these regulations. They require us to have a plan in place to respond to any radiation emergency on our sites.

An online version of our REPPIR booklet is available via the QR code on the back page – it explains how you would be alerted, actions to take, and contains a map of the emergency planning zones. This information is also available on the West Berkshire Council website: www.westberks.gov.uk/awe

Your feedback from our public drop-in sessions
