Further to our previous correspondence regarding your request for the following information:

- \*The date on which t the AWE applied for and had approved a retention instrument to keep hold of all documents that form part of the Merlin database at AWE
- \* The reasons given for the retention of these documents
- \* The date on which the Secretary of State for the MoD, or a junior minister, was informed of either the application or the approval of the retention of these documents

Your request has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act).

We apologise for the delay in responding to your request. A search for the requested information within AWE has now been completed, and we can confirm that some of the information in scope of your request is held.

AWE does not hold any information for the date AWE applied for The Lord Chancellors Instrument (LCI) 118, however we can disclose that it was approved on 18th December 2014.

AWE holds some of the information relating to your second question, however we are withholding it under section 21 of the Act as the information is reasonably accessible and has been addressed in a previous FOI:
